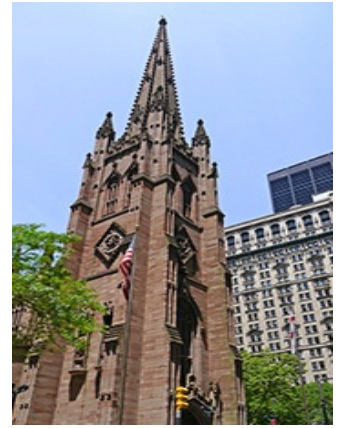

**The Rev. Canon George W. Brandt**

The Rev. Canon George Brandt was born in New York City. He attended Franklin and Marshall college. He holds a Law Degree from Boston College and a Master of Divinity from Nashota House Theological Seminary. He has been very active in his Law career, including working for the US Securities and Exchange Commission, Rogers & Wells, and, since 2016, as an Arbitrator for Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA). The Rev. Canon Brandt has served as Rector of St. Michael's Church in Manhattan and St. Margaret of Scotland, in Chicago. He also served as Canon, Cathedral of St. Philip in Atlanta as well as Provincial Secretary and PA to the Archbishop, Church of the Province of Central Africa. He is currently Honorary Assistant at Church of the Incarnation in Manhattan and is a member of the Sacred Sites Committee of the New York Landmarks Conservancy.

**Fred Bland**

Fred Bland is Managing Partner of Beyer, Blinder, Bell Architects & Planners LLP. He is a member of Grace Church Brooklyn and serves on the Vestry of Trinity Wall Street. He is a graduate of Yale University. He is a Commissioner on the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission and chairs the Brooklyn Botanic Garden.

**Colleen Heemeyer**

Colleen Heemeyer is the Grants and Technical Services Manager at the New York Landmarks Conservancy. She helps run the Conservancy's Sacred Sites program which provides matching grants and technical assistance to historic religious institutions in New York State. Colleen and her husband are both active in the parish of St. Ann and the Holy Trinity Church, an 1844 Episcopal Church in Brooklyn Heights. In 2015, Colleen ended two three-year terms on the parish's vestry.

**Peter A. Irwin**

Peter "Tony" Irwin was born in Pasadena, California. He grew up in Bronxville, New York, received a B.A. from Pomona College and a J.D. and LL.M. from NYU. He worked as an attorney at Con Edison for 36 years, retiring in 2008, first as a corporate and transactional lawyer, then in supervisory positions. He was on the Vestry and Strategic Planning Committee at St. Luke in the Fields during the selection of a developer of some underused real estate, and the negotiation of long-term leases with the developer and with St. Luke's School."
