The Right Reverend Nicholas Holtam has been Bishop of Salisbury since 2011. He oversees a diocese that stretches from Wiltshire's Marlborough Downs to Dorset's Jurassic Coast with nearly 460 parishes, 574 places of worship and 196 Church schools. For 5 years he chaired the Church of England's Committee for Ministry with and Among Deaf and Disabled People. He is the Church of England's Lead Bishop on the Environment and is one of the 26 Lords Spiritual.

He is a Vice President of the National Churches Trust and of the Royal School of Church Music.

Nick grew up in North London and read Geography at Durham University. After working in a hostel for young homeless ex-offenders in Leeds he read Theology at King's College London and completed his ordination training at Westcott House Cambridge. After serving a curacy in Stepney in East End of London (1979-83) he taught Christian Ethics and Mission at Lincoln Theological College (1983-87). He was Vicar of the Isle of Dogs (1988-95) at the heart of the regeneration of London's Docklands where the Kray brothers' driver volunteered to be his minder.

As Vicar of St. Martin-in-the-Fields 1995-2011, he led the highly acclaimed £36 million buildings renewal. St Martin's is an architectural model for many churches in the US. He first met the Church Club through the need to fundraise. The US Friends of St Martin's continue to be generous supporters of that iconic church. In his time the Royal Parish Church of St Martin's continued to develop and grow, serving homeless people, immigrants and asylum seekers and establishing a Mandarin speaking Chinese congregation alongside the existing Cantonese speaking one.

He revived the tradition of BBC broadcasting from St Martin's and developed a close relationship with the neighbouring National Gallery bringing together that church's strong ethical tradition with aesthetics and the beauty of holiness.

He is an Hon Fellow of the Guild of Church Musicians, an Hon Doctor of Civil Law from the University of Durham and a Fellow of King's College London. He is married to Helen, a Quaker. They have four children and five grandchildren
